#### Now, for a little history ...

Chinese New Year is the longest and most important celebration in the Chinese calendar. The Chinese year 4706 began on Feb. 7, 2008. Chinese months are reckoned by the lunar calendar, with each month beginning on the darkest day. New Year festivities traditionally start on the first day of the month and continue until the fifteenth, when the moon is brightest. In China, people may take weeks of holiday from work to prepare for and celebrate the New Year.

A Ratty Year (This is the year of the Rat according to Chinese Mythology)

Legend has it that in ancient times, Buddha asked all the animals to meet him on Chi-

nese New Year. Twelve came, and Buddha named a year after each one. He announced that the people born in each animal's year would have some of that animal's personality. Those born in rat years tend to be leaders, pioneers, and

Dragon Dance & Lantern Festival....

The lantern festival is held on the fifteenth day of the first lunar month. Some of the lanterns may be works of art, painted with birds, animals, flowers, zodiac signs, and scenes from legend and history. People hang glowing lanterns in temples, and carry lanterns to an evening parade under the light of the full moon. In many areas the highlight of the lantern festival is the dragon dance. The dragon—which might stretch a hundred feet long—is typically made of silk, paper, and bamboo. Traditionally the dragon is held aloft by young men who dance as they guide the colorful beast through the streets.

pore, with each region possessing their own styles. Chinese lion dances can be broadly categorised into two styles,

Northern (北獅) and Southern (南獅). Northern dance was used as entertainment for the imperial court. The northern lion is usually red, orange, and yellow (sometimes with green fur for the female lion), shaggy in appearance, with a golden head. The northern dance is acrobatic and is mainly performed as entertainment.

Deborah and I are at the pinnacle of all crossroads that we have ever faced. We asked God last year to show us if He means us to stay here long term. The only way we can stay truly <u>legally</u> long term is to get Hong Kong work visas. 2 days AFTER we asked God this in prayer. We got a call (last year) from our brother Vidar from Norway saying they could possibly apply for our work visa's through New Life based on the fact that I have had past software experience, and I would be able to help them put together a web driven database for New Life Japan. YE HAW God answers prayer! We thought God answered with a BIG YES. But it seems He was saying wait. As we filled out all the appropriate paperwork last year before our furlough (05/19/2007), and the paperwork was not submitted until 02/01/2008. The process is supposed to take 6 weeks, and it is no easy road for certain. To

add to the dilemma, our lease on our apartment, is up in August, and we will be expected to make a decision to renew it, or not. We really cannot make a decision about renewing our lease, or even when to come home for furlough, until we know whether our work visas are approved. So we humbly ask all of you to join us on our knees, and ask the Lord to show us the way. If He grants us our HK work visa's we accept that He has called us here full time, long term, period. If we are not approved for HK work visa's, well then what's next? We Know Not ....

But we will be looking for His directions elsewhere. Please help us by asking Him to show us the way He wants us to go ...
